LocalEUCharter will contribute to understanding and disseminating the EU Charter on Fundamental Rights, to implement it on the local municipal policies, and also to improving knowledge of EU policies, thus reducing Euroscepticism. In this way, participants will learn common values such as "promoting peace", "well-being of citizens", "social commitment" and "network development", as indicated by the specific objectives of the 2020 guide. Thus, we will meet two relevant objectives:

- 1. We will disseminate the values of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union from a bottom-up approach. In other words, this awareness will descend from the institutions to the general public, thus improving the governance of the institutions (which is one of the main priorities of the CERV program).
- 2. It will allow the project to meet the needs of European citizens from the point of view of civil society agents directly linked to citizens: youngsters, officials with the inhabitants of their municipalities and technical social workers with the groups for which they work in their respective associations.

The project divided into 8 international events (one for each project partner) and aimed to directly involve more than 400 participants, and indirectly more than 25,000 reached people. Each project partner will organize a project international event involving local and regional participants, taking in advance collaboration with other local and regional related organizations or other local events in order to achieve a bigger project impact. Regarding the activities, the places will vary depending on each city.
